Watching someone else process your images can be an eye-opening experience as things you might not consider are looked at in detail.



An understanding of basic layers and masks is recommended but the process of using layers and masks will be expanded upon. Subject matter will include: Refined Selections and Masking, Applying Image techniques for masking, Selected sharpening techniques, Understanding Curves Luminosity and Color Contrasting Blend Modes, BlendIf for control of highlight and shadows and Color Grading.
