





A Desperate Fortune by Susanna Kearsley


Lord John and the Private Matter by Diana Gabaldon


11/22/63 by Stephen King


My Name is Mary Sutter by Robin Oliveira

A schoolmarm leaves England in 1792 to join her father and brother in a village in upstate New York, where she falls in love with a man torn between white and Native American culture.




The Scribe of Siena by Melodie Winawer
