by Angie Thomas

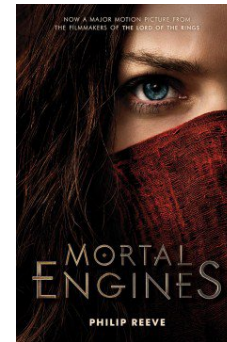

by Walter Dean Myers

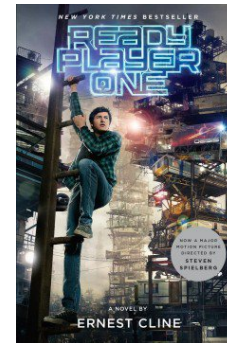

by Philip Reeve

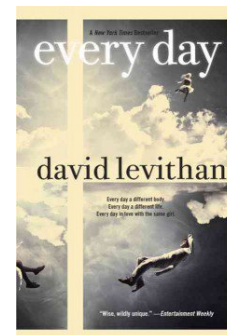
