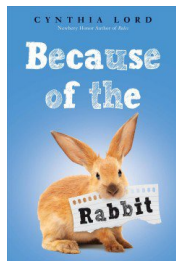

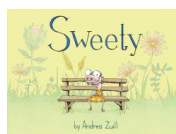
KATIE

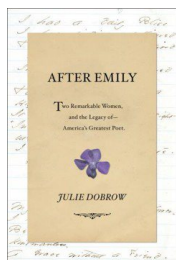
Sweety

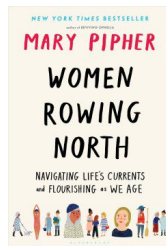


Killing with confetti

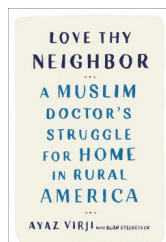


Women rowing North

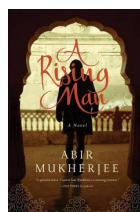


Love thy neighbor : a Muslim doctor's struggle for home in rural America
