





The Chelsea Girls by Fiona Davis


Finding Dorothy by Elizabeth Letts


The Secrets We Kept by Lara Prescott


The Nickel Boys by Colson Whitehead


The Poppy Wife by Caroline Scott

Hired by other families looking for MIA soldiers, a grieving man searches for his own missing brother along the Western Front, where he photographs soldier graves while making life-changing discoveries.




Summer of '69 by Elin Hilderbrand
