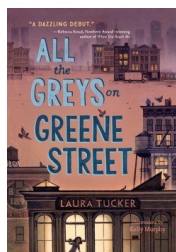

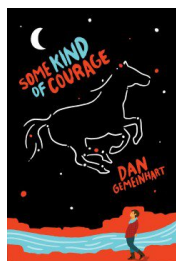


## All the Greys on Greene Street

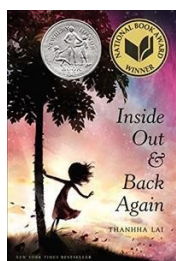


## Some Kind of Courage

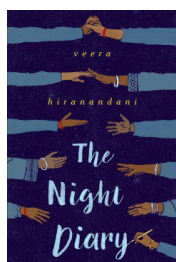


## Inside Out & Back Again

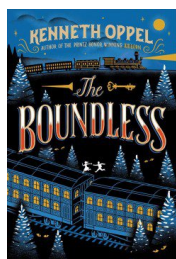


## The Night Diary

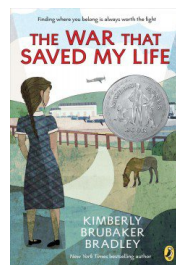


## The Boundless

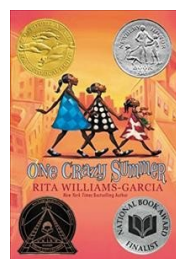


## The War that Saved My Life

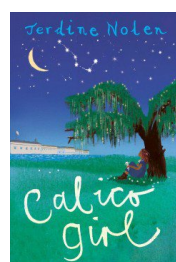


## One Crazy Summer

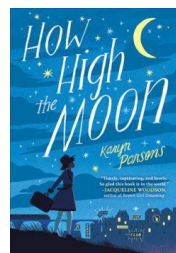


## Calico Girl

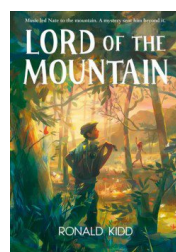


## How High the Moon

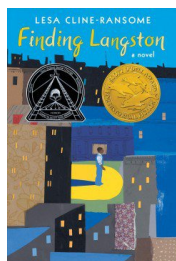


## Under the Broken Sky

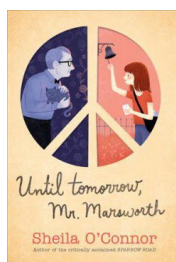


## Finding Langston

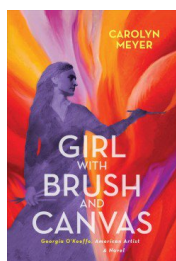


## Until Tomorrow, Mr. Marsworth

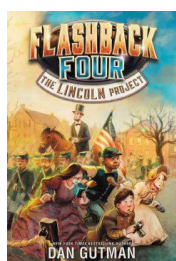


## Girl with Brush and Canvas: Georgia O'Keeffe, American Artist

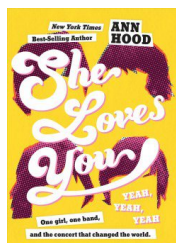


## The Lincoln Project

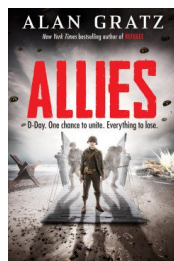


## Stella by Starlight

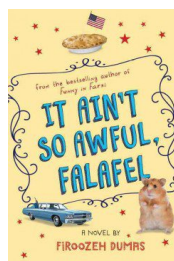


## Allies

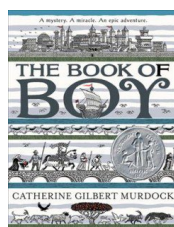


## It Ain't so Awful, Falafel

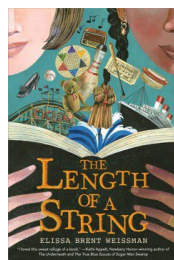


## The Book of Boy

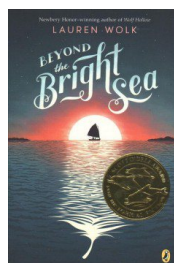


## The Length of a String
