

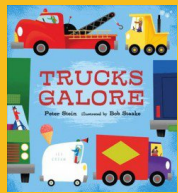


Things That Go

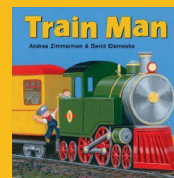

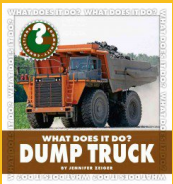

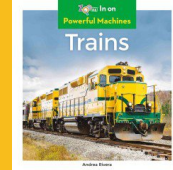
