

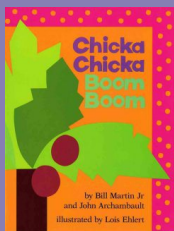


## Toddler Reading List

### The Day the Crayons Quit

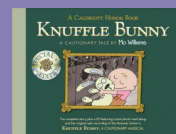
by Drew Daywalt

## The Lion & the Mouse

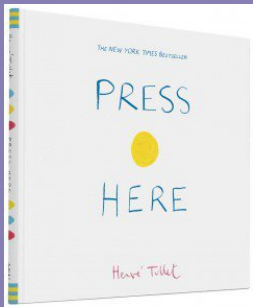
by Jerry Pinkney
