

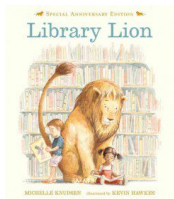

Library Lion

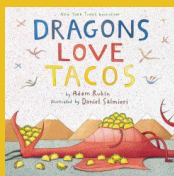

Dragons Love Tacos

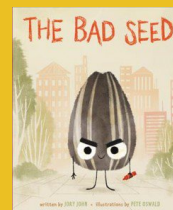
by Adam Rubin

Truman


