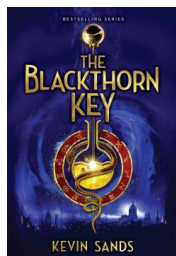




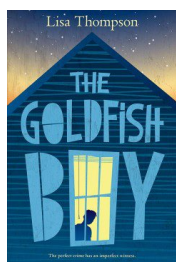
The Strangers

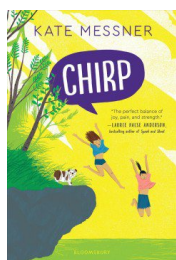
The Blackthorn Key

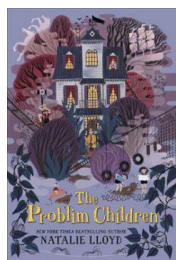
The Goldfish Boy

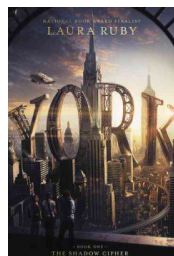
The Problem Children

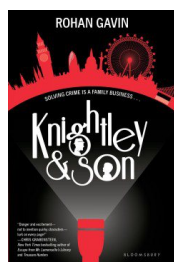
The Westing Game

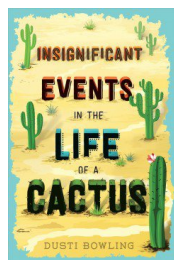
Knightley & Son
