Kanopy

American Mosaic: The Latino American Experience

Telling the Latino experience first-hand, through the voices of Latino authors and contributors, this database includes hundreds of primary source documents such as maps, images, audio clips, interviews, music files, speeches, documents, links to relevant websites and other material.

World Scholar: Latin America and the Caribbean

This <u>database</u> includes a comprehensive range of content for the region, including primary source documents, periodicals, multimedia and more. It provides research across the humanities both for current issues and events in Latin America and the Caribbean as well as for historical perspective back to the colonial period.

Arizona Memory Project: Arizona Latina Trailblazers
