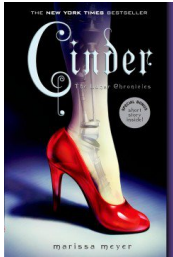

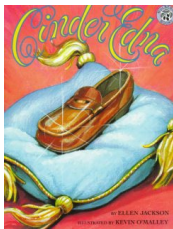

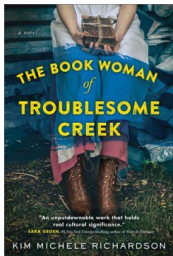


## Cinder Edna

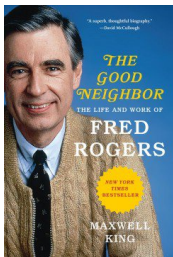


## The book woman of Troublesome Creek : a novel

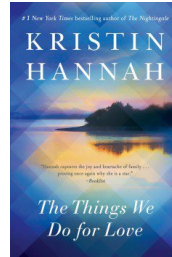


## The good neighbor : the life and work of Fred Rogers

Drawing on original interviews, oral histories and archival documents, the author traces the iconic children's program host's personal, professional, and artistic life through decades of work.

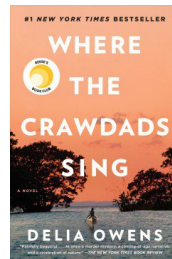

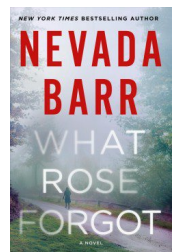


## Where the crawdads sing

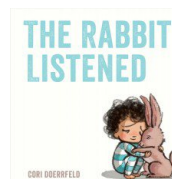


## What Rose forgot

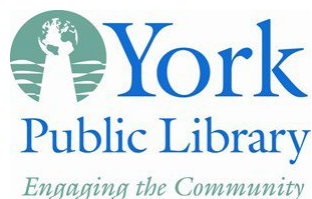


## The rabbit listened
