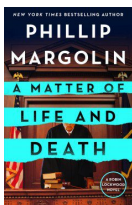
Sunflower Sisters

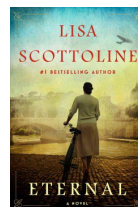

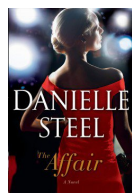
A Matter of Life and Death

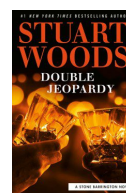
Eternal
