



















Sing!

Talk!

Talking about a book as you read it to your child is a great way to engage them and increase their critical thinking which will, in turn, help them learn to read! Consider asking them to predict what happens next, to count the animals on a page, to compare your family to the families you see in the books, and anything else that gets your child talking!

Play!

Use pillows, blankets, cushions, and chairs to build a massive fort. Use a flashlight inside and cuddle up and read books together!

Family Fun Clouds Materials Needed:

- · White paper for cloud
- Colorful construction paper
- Markers
- Glue stick
- Scissors
- Decorations (glitter, stickers, etc.)
- 1) Help your child cut out a large cloud shape from the white paper and glue it to a sheet of construction paper.
- 2) Help your child cut the colored construction paper into strips to glue under the cloud like rainbow sunshine rays (around 6 strips).

- 5) Decorate! Use glitter, stickers, sequins, whatever you have, to decorate your project!
- 6) Together, make one for each member of the family!


Sign!
