


The Bastard Legion

Thief and hacker Miska Corbin takes control of a prison spaceship and converts the inmates into her own private mercenary army, a legion that will help Miska on her quest.




Barbary Station



A young anthropologist specializing in ancient technology makes the astonishing discovery that a race of human-like machines has been hiding among people for untold centuries.




Thrawn: Treason








Semiosis




Exhalation: Stories

A collection of short stories that will make you think, grapple with big questions, and feel more human.




Walkaway

Abandoning formal society to pursue a minimalist counterculture life, a disenchanted senior and his heiress paramour inspire a host of followers who become obsessed with cheating death.




A Boy and His Dog at the **End of the World**

When a beloved family dog is stolen, her boy owner sets out on a life-changing journey through the ruins of a dystopian world to bring her back.




Agency




The Wanderers




Thin Air
