

Field trip fiasco by James Patterson

Genre: Humorous Fiction

Summary: This is another story by James Patterson about Middle School and how to survive it. However this story isn't about surviving Middle School itself; it is about surviving an art sleep away camp. Rafe Khatchadorian wins a spot to go to California, at Camp Culture, which he thought was going to be in Hollywood Ca. but it was in the desert, at Crocodile rocks near a town called Bigbottom.
