BOOK ADVENTURE: WHAT'S YOUR STORY?


Identity flag. Design a flag that represents your identity - what you feel makes you who you are. You might be inspired by an existing symbol or flag, or you might like to make something no one has ever seen before!


Try something new. Have you been thinking about wanting to learn something new? Ask a friend or family member to teach you something that they are really good at, maybe playing a sport or doing a craft. Remember to check with your local library to find books to help you learn more!

Family histories. Ask your parents, grandparents or any older relative to tell you about what their life was like when they were your age. Where were they born, and how did they come to live where they do now?

Remember that recipe. Do you have a favorite food that a member of your family makes? Ask them to help you write out the recipe for the dish. Or maybe you'd like to try to make the dish together!


