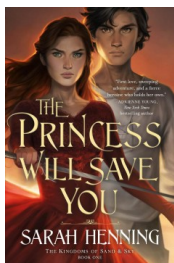


Daughter of the deep

classmates face deadly enemies during their weekend trial at sea.

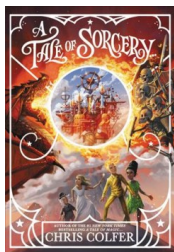


The Princess Will Save You

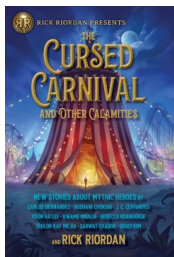
kidnapped. But Amarande was raised to be a warrior, not a sacrifice. And nothing will stop her from saving her true love.

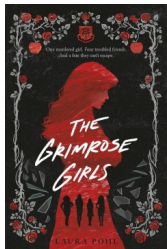


Any way the wind blows

by Alex London

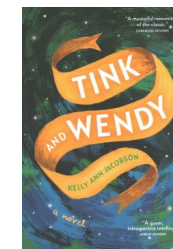
