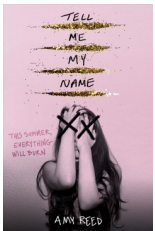
In this powerful retelling of the classic novel, four young Black sisters, coming of age during the American Civil War, face first love, health issues, heartbreak and new horizons.

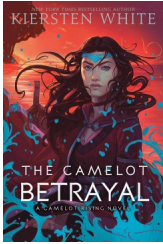

by Kiersten White

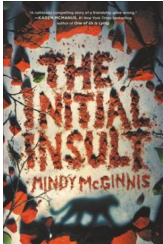

by Addie Thorley

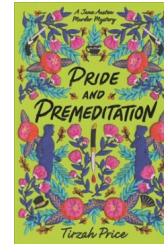
After being exiled to a monastery for losing control of her powers, Enebish's sister Ghoha returns from the war front with an offer Enebish just cannot refuse.

by Tirzah Price

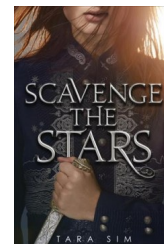

by Sarah Henning

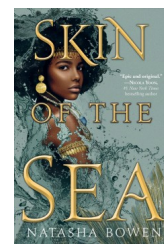
