## • Creative Programming in the Midst of Recommended Health Guidelines

The conditions over the past two years have limited our ability to offer in-library programming, but we have continued to offer creative programming opportunities. We hope to offer more programming options in 2022.



We were happy to offer **preschool story time** once again starting in September. Our former leaders, Gloria McQuaid and Marilyn Snyder have stepped back. New leaders, Debbie Young and Jane Buckley, continue to offer fun and learning for our kids. Preschoolers meet each Thursday at 10:30 to play, hear a great story, and participate in group activities.



Our volunteers continue our book clubs, meeting during closed hours to allow for more room to meet. Sandy Lindsey leads a Wednesday afternoon club meeting at 2 p.m. while Beth Creekpaum leads an afternoon club which meets every other Thursday at 1 p.m.



The library offered an Alternative Egg Hunt to replace the Community Egg Hunt, which was cancelled due to health concerns. During the month of March, we had 140 people ranging from toddlers to adults who participated in a scavenger hunt for "eggs." Kids won prizes along the way and at the end of the hunt.



Our Summer Reading Program once again looked a little different this year. Kids (and adults, too!) were given the opportunity to track their reading online, earning points and rewards along the way. Throughout their "journey,' they were provided activities and treats through Grab n' Go Bags. We had a story teller, Tim Hartman, visit and entertain us in the park plus an animal scavenger hunt for kids. Throughout the summer, kids collectively earned 539 badges for completing activities. Those logging minutes read 15,985 minutes collectively, and those logging books read a total of 1,630 books.

Our Community Supporters held several successful fund raisers for the library including a Soup Sale, a Beef Raffle, a Bake Sale, and a Purse Bingo Night. Thank you all who contributed to these efforts!


