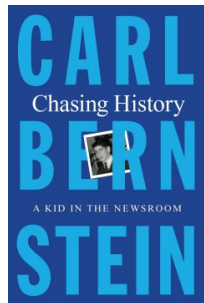

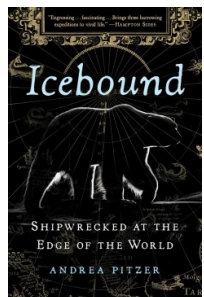

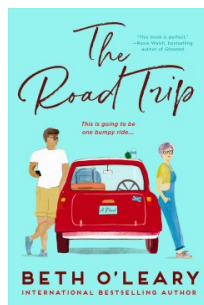
One Two Three

Two rising 70s rock-and-roll artists are catapulted into stardom when a producer puts them together, a decision that is complicated by a pregnancy and the seductions of fame.



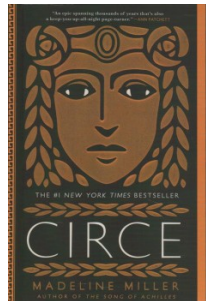
The Road Trip

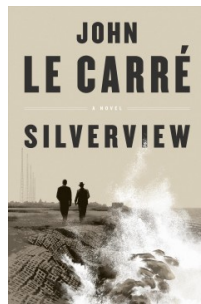
The Return

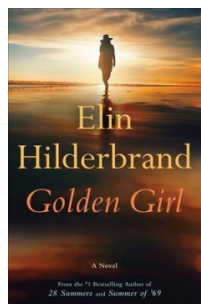
Circe: A Novel

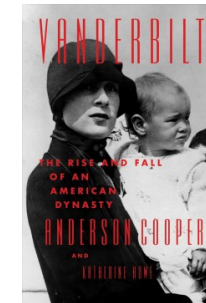
