
Volunteers continue our two book clubs, meeting during closed hours to allow for more room. Sandy Lindsey and Beth Creekpaum lead the groups.

Forty-two signed up for the summer reading challenge, and 129 children and adults participated in the eight weekly, summer programs. They included yoga, birdhouse building, butterflies, and cooking with Chef Arnold. Katelyn Struthers facilitated the summer program, and library volunteers assisted.


