To access e-books and e-audiobooks:

1. Download or open Libby on your device:
Apple App Store (for iOS devices)
Google Play (for Android devices)
Direct download from OverDrive, the developers of Libby (for Amazon Fire tablets)
libbyapp.com (for Windows, Mac, and Chromebooks)
Note: libbyapp.com works best in up-to-date versions of Chrome, Safari, Firefox, and Edge.
2. In Libby, follow the prompts to find your library and sign in with a library card.
3. Search or browse and borrow a title in the format you want (availability varies).
4. Borrowed titles appear on your Shelf and download to the app automatically when you're connected to Wi-Fi, so you can read them when you're offline.

On your Shelf, tap loans at the top of the screen. From there, you can:

Tap Read With... to choose where you'd like to read the book (Kindle or Libby), then finish sending to Kindle (U.S. libraries only) or start reading in Libby.


Tap Open In Libby, or Open Audiobook to start reading or listening in the app.


Tap Manage Loan to see options like Renew and Return.

by Naomi Krupitsky



by Kiley Reid



by Alice Feeney



The Glass Hotel


by Emily St. John Mandel



Long Island Reads



by Rachel Hawkins


