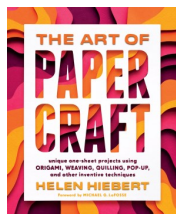

by Jonathan Abrams

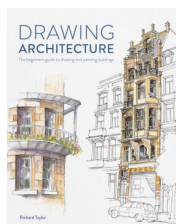

by Richard Taylor

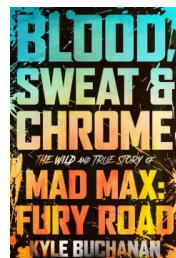

by Héctor Tajonar and Roxana Velásquez

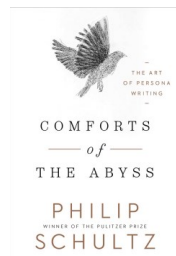

by Jenette McCurdy

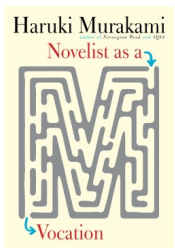

by Nancy Slonim Aronie

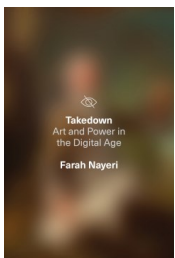

by Haruki Murakami

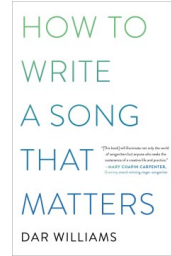

by Farah Nayeri

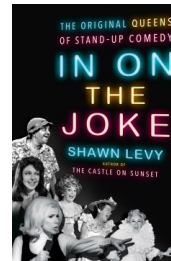

by Dar Williams

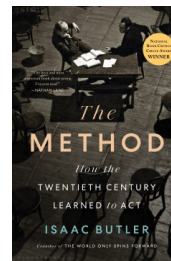
