


Simply Lies

A twisty new psychological thriller in which two women—one a former detective, the other a dangerous con artist—go head-to-head in an electrifying game of cat and mouse. (4/18)




Where are the Children Now?


Happy Place

The Making of Another Major Motion Picture Masterpiece



A novel about the making of a star-studded, multimillion-dollar superhero action film...and the humble comic books that inspired it. (5/9)




The Half Moon




The Wind Knows My Name


The 9th Man


Fire Strike
