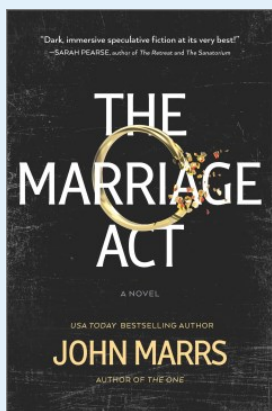

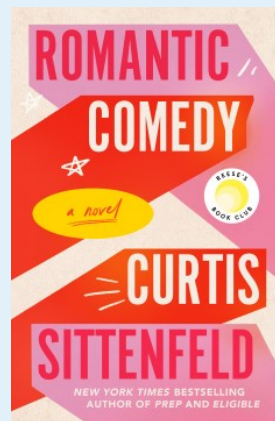

by John Marrs

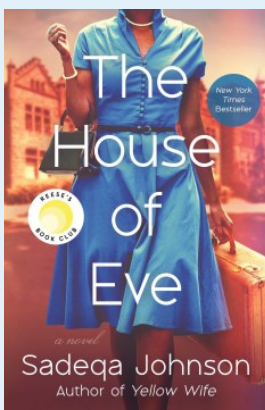

by Curtis Sittenfeld

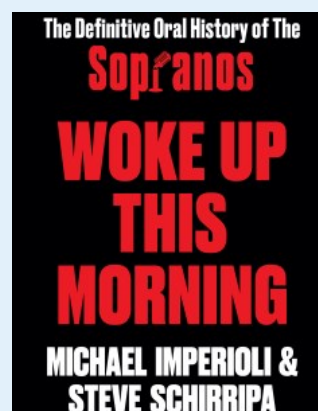
