

Ten-year-old Emile finds himself in the middle of the secret headquarters for France's undercover superheroes where he helps them save both Benjamin Franklin and the world.




The Witch, the Sword, and the Cursed Knights




Brand New Boy






The Secret Letters

In this Malaysian retelling of *Little Red Riding Hood*, 13-year-old Hamra, along with her friend Ilyas, head out on a mission to set things right.




Attack of the Black Rectangles
