

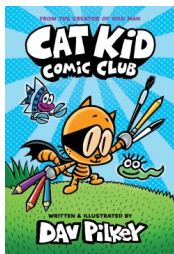

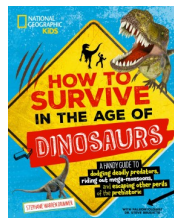

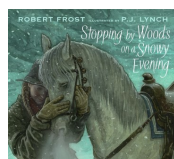


How to Survive in the Age of Dinosaurs

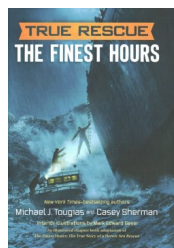


Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening

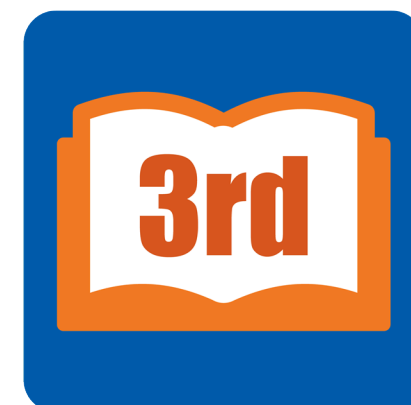

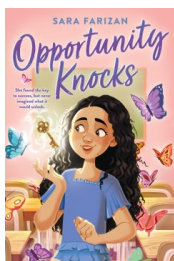


The Race to Erase

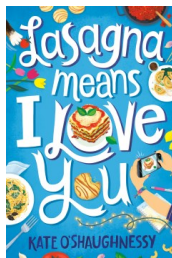


Skyriders

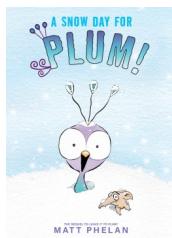


Lasagna Means I Love You

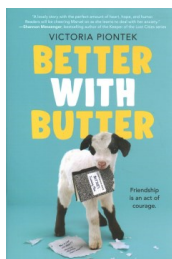


A Snow Day for Plum!

Drafted to serve as a knight of King Arthur's Round Table, 12-year-old Ellie must embrace her witch magic to break a wicked curse.

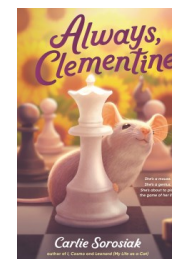


Come See the Fair
