by Maylis de Kerangal



by Tan Twan Eng



by Christoffer Carlsson



by Akira Mizubayashi




How to Love Your Daughter

The List



by Jo Nesbø



by Ayoʻbámi Adébáyoʻ



by Chiang-Sheng Kuo


