

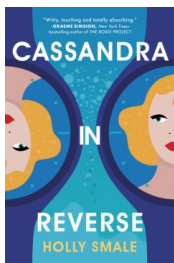

by Lauren Beukes

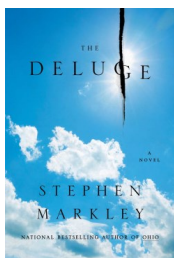

by Stephen Markley

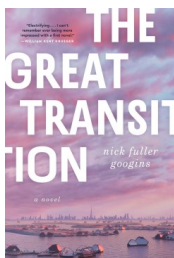

by Jinwoo Chong

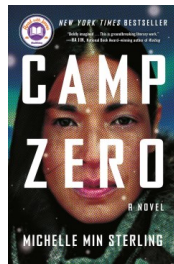

by Nick Fuller Googins

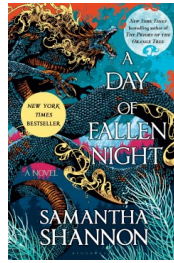

by Samantha Shannon

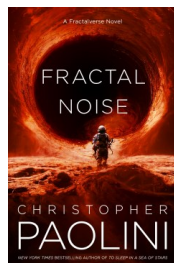

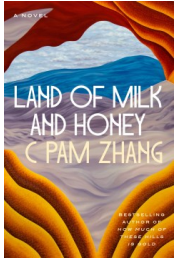


## In the Lives of Puppets

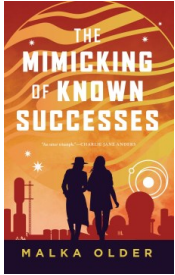

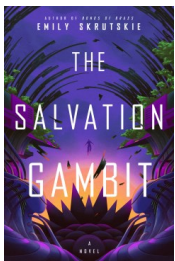

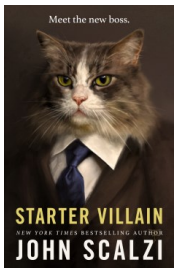
**Land of Milk and Honey**

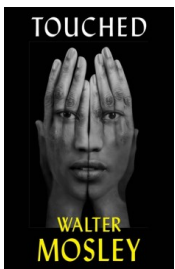
**The Mimicking of Known Successes**

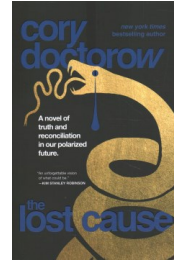
**The Salvation Gambit**

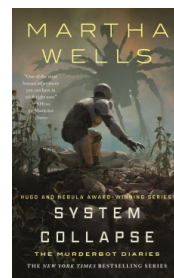
**The Lost Cause**

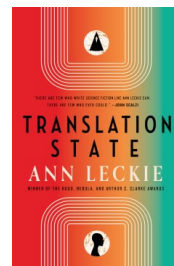
**Please Report Your Bug Here**
