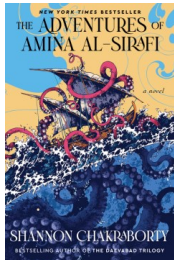




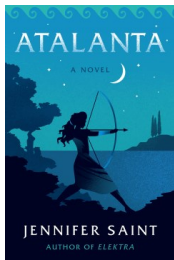

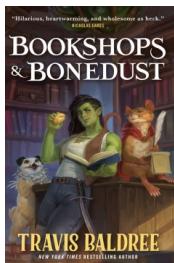

by Jennifer Saint

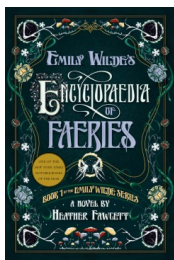

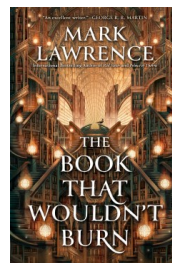

by Mark Lawrence

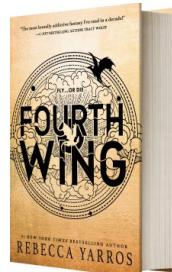

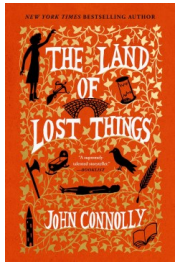


In the Lives of Puppets

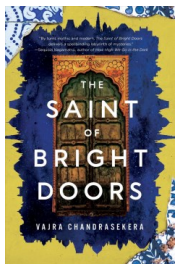

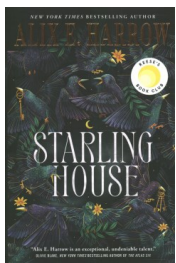

by Vajra Chandrasekera

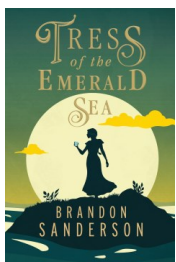

by Cherie Dimaline

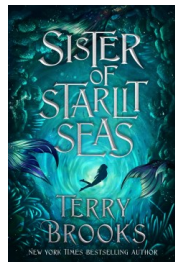

by Natalie Haynes

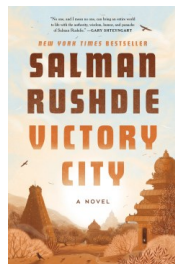
