
This Tender Land

A podcaster meets her "birthday twin" and decides to center her new podcast on this, on the surface, abused woman. But what is true and what isn't? There are some triggers - abuse, alcoholism. It is also dark, tense, suspenseful. But I loved it - great psychological thriller.
