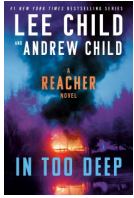

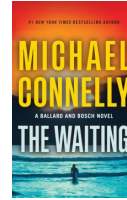

by Lee Child

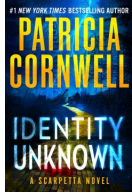

by Patricia Cornwell

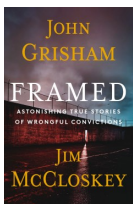

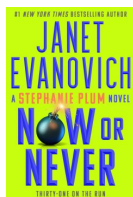
We Three Queens

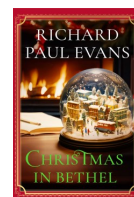
Cher: The Memoir Part 1

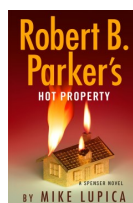
A Very Bad Thing

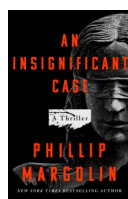
Now or Never

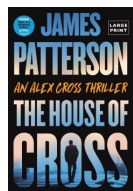
Christmas in Bethel

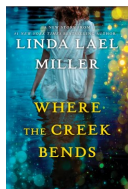
