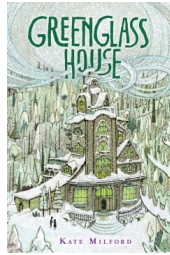

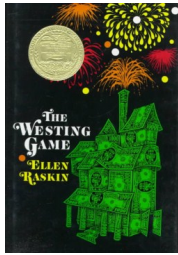

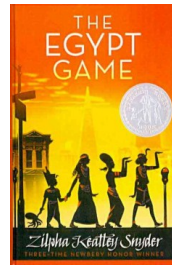

[The Egypt Game](#) by Zilpha Keatley Snyder

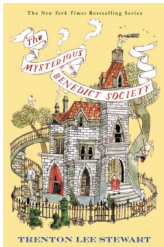

[The Mysterious Benedict Society](#) by Trenton Lee Stewart

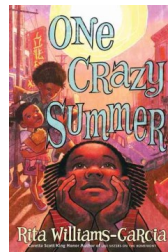
