







A tattooed nun who moonlights at a detective agency feels she is called on by god to find the killer after discovering a dead priest in the second novel of the series following *Scorched Grace*.

by A. J. Finn



by Walter Mosley



by Liz Moore



by Kristen Perrin







by Alex Michaelides






The Hunter



by John Shen & Yen Nee


