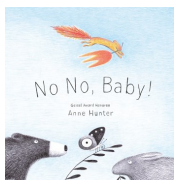


A Best Friend for Bear

An enthusiastic baby squirrel and some grumpy forest friends collide in this sweet story.

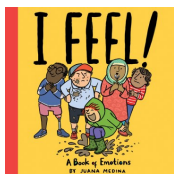


Pig in Jeans

Vibrant art and simple text combine to show young readers how to build emotional literacy, affirm their emotions, and improve communication skills.

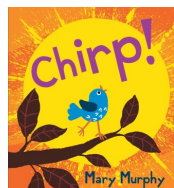


Ruffles and the New Green Thing

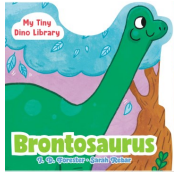

Learn all about Brontosaurus, aka the thunder lizard dinosaur, as he stomps through each page.

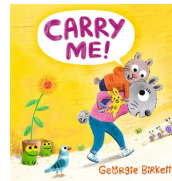


Boop!

There are so many snoots to boop! Snoots attached to big dogs, little dogs, dogs with beards, and those without. Are you ready to boop all the snoots?

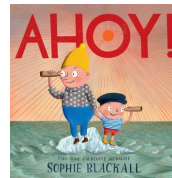


Carry Me!
