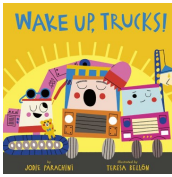

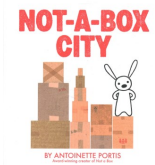

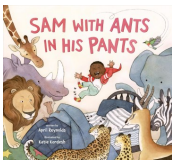
## Wake Up, Trucks!

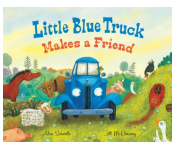
## Not-a-Box City

Bunny wants to build a new city alone, until they realize that friends make all the difference.



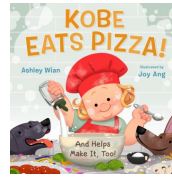
## Sam With Ants in His Pants

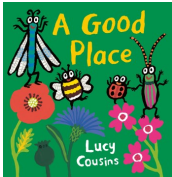
An extremely exuberant chicken has an important message to share and reminds us that trying our best is reason enough to celebrate!
