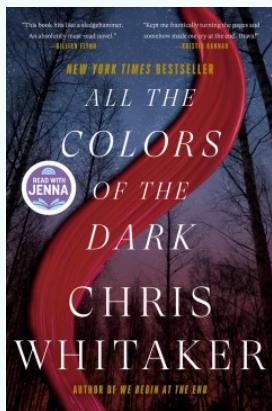

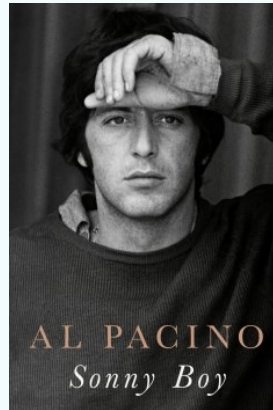
All the Colors of the Dark
