




by Maureen Callahan



by Dava Sobel








## John Lewis



by Katie Gee Salisbury



by Kelly Bishop



by Melania Trump


A memoir of a first lady offers a glimpse into the life of a woman who navigated several challenges in a prominent and very public position in our country.
