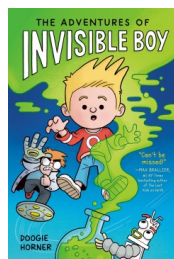

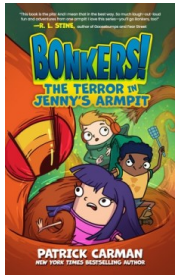


Worst Week Ever: Monday

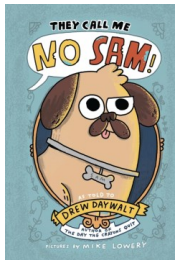


The Terror in Jenny's Armpit

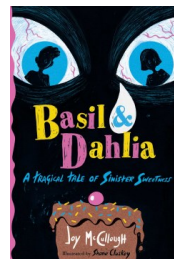


Slugfest

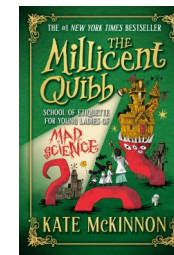


Bunny and Clyde
