



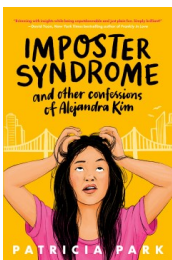

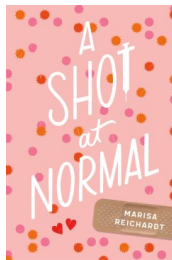
### Imposter Syndrome and Other Confessions of Alejandra Kim

When a microaggression at her wealthy high school thrusts her into the spotlight, Alejandra must carve out a place for herself while dealing with the loss of her father.



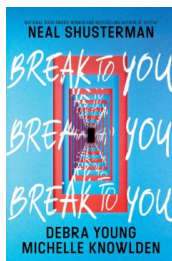
### The 9:09 Project

After contracting measles with devastating consequences, 16-year-old Juniper Jade sues her anti-vaccination parents, hoping she can have a more normal life.



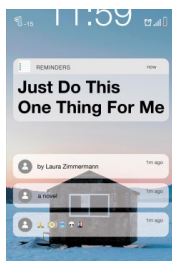
### Break to You

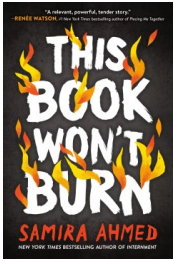

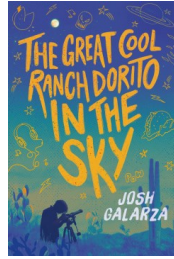


## This Book Won't Burn

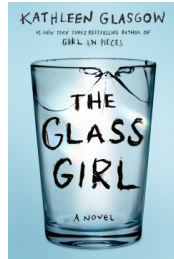


## Dispatches From Parts Unknown

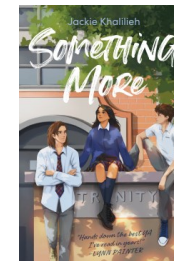


## The Misdirection of Fault Lines

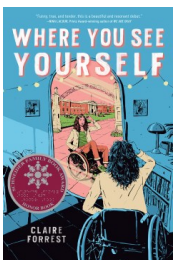


## Something More
