


What You Are Looking for Is in the Library

Tokyo's most mysterious librarian, Sayuri Komachi, gives her visitors one unexpected book, which has life-altering consequences.




Lessons in Chemistry




The River We Remember




Wandering Stars

Tracing the legacies of the Sand Creek Massacre in 1864 to the aftermath of a school shooting, Opal tries to hold her family together while connecting with her heritage.




Tom Lake

Recalling the past at her daughters' request, Lara tells the story of a famous actor with whom she shared both a stage and a romance. This causes her daughters to examine their own lives.




The Seven Husbands of Evelyn Hugo




Lady Tan's Circle of Women

Sent into an arranged marriage, Tan Yunxian, forbidden to continue her work as a midwife-in-training, is ordered to act like a proper wife.




The Violin Conspiracy
