by Emily Henry

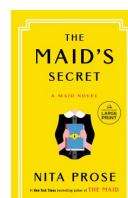
Two writers compete for the chance to tell the larger-than-life story of a woman with more than a couple of plot twists up her sleeve. (4/22)

by J.A. Jance

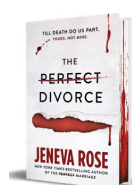
