by Aevar por Benediktsson The author humorously recounts the time his grandfather got stranded with a friend on a brand new volcanic island in Iceland. The


adventurers faced epic challenges like molten lava, melted eyeglasses and scant supplies before finally getting rescued.




We Are Definitely Human

by Ziga X. Gombac



Mr. Fox's Game of "No!"



by Andy Lee


Take a hilarious trip through time with a reluctant tour guide. Readers will delight in doing exactly what they are asked NOT to do.
