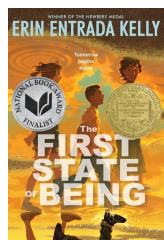

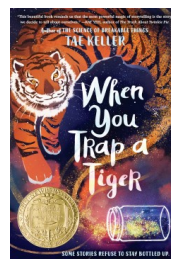

by Erin Entrada Kelly

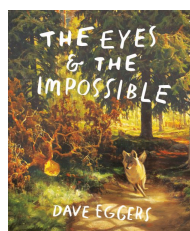

by Dave Eggers

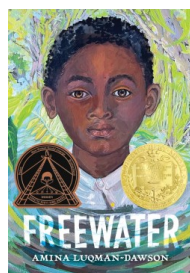

by Jerry Craft

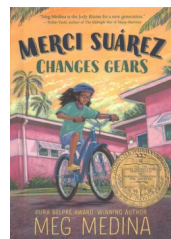

by Amina Luqman-Dawson

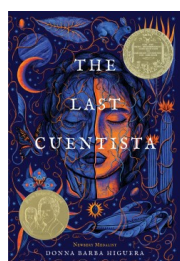

by Meg Medina

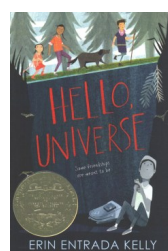

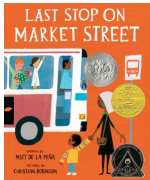

by Kelly Regan Barnhill

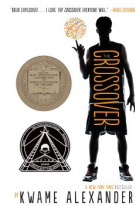

by Matt de la Peña

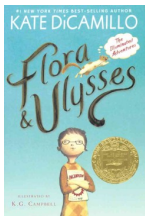
A young boy rides the bus across town with his grandmother and learns to appreciate the beauty in everyday things.

by Kwame Alexander

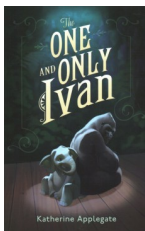
Fourteen-year-old twin basketball stars Josh and Jordan wrestle with highs and lows on and off the court as their father ignores his declining health.

by Kate DiCamillo

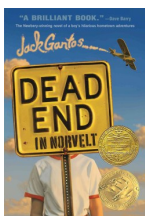

by Rebecca Stead

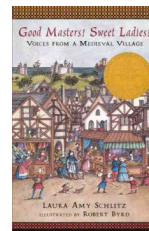
A twelve-year-old New York City girl tries to make sense of a series of mysterious notes received from an anonymous source that seems to defy the laws of time and space.

by Neil Gaiman

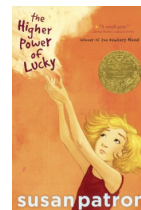
After the grisly murder of his entire family, a toddler wanders into a graveyard where the ghosts and other supernatural residents agree to raise him as one of their own.

by Laura Amy Schlitz

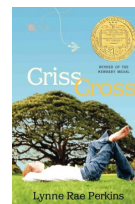
A collection of short one-person plays featuring characters, between ten and fifteen years old, who live in or near a thirteenth-century English manor.
