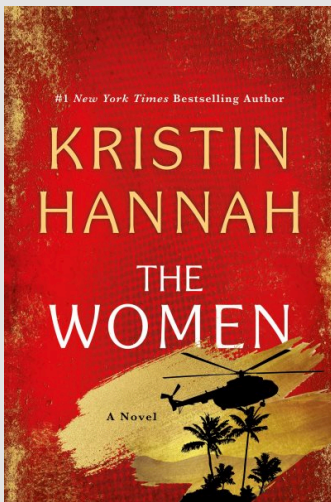


# Ellen's PICKS

For books read in May 2025

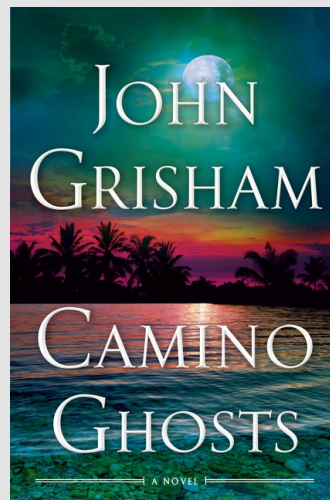
