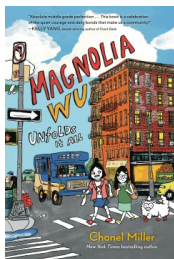

A peacock ambassador for the Athensville Zoo, Plum must save the day when a very small marsupial with a big ego tries to escape and take over the zoo.

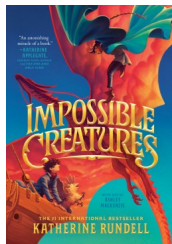


It's the End of the World and I'm in My Bathing Suit

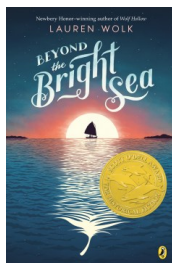


The Story of Diva and Flea

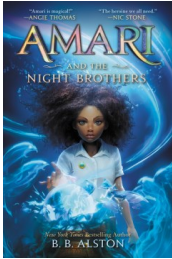

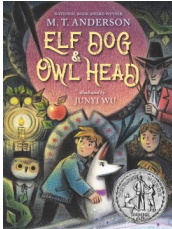


Amari and the Night Brothers

Thirteen-year-old Amari, a poor Black girl from the projects, gets an invitation from her missing brother to join the Bureau of Supernatural Affairs.

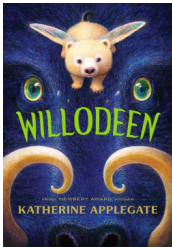


Elf Dog & Owl Head

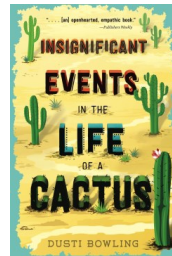


Wishes and Wellingtons

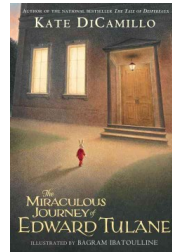


The Wishkeeper's Apprentice

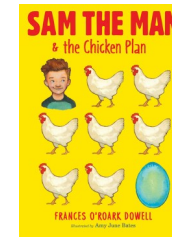


The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane

When 7-year-old Sam Graham volunteers to look after a neighbor's chickens, the experience inspires him to get his own chicken—a special bird named Helga.

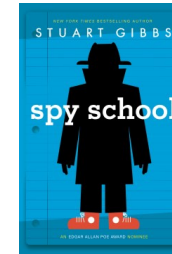


The City of Ember

In the year 241, 12-year-old Lina finds part of an ancient message that she is sure holds a secret to save her underground city from ruin.

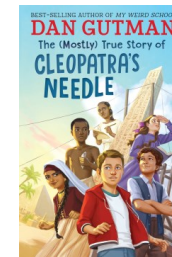


Spy School
