

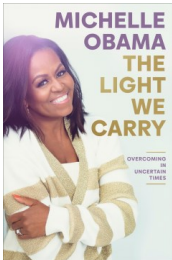

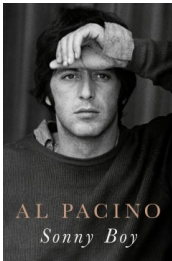


The Light We Carry

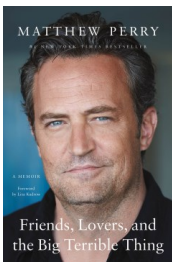


Sonny Boy
