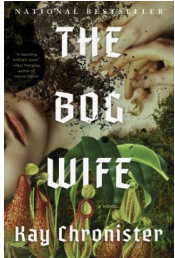


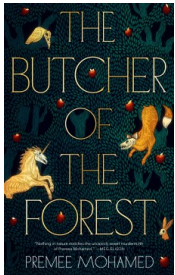

by Kay Chronister

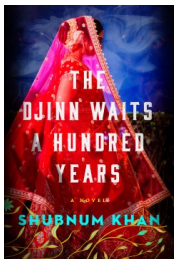

by Premee Mohamed

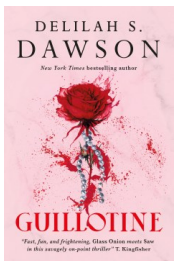

by Shubnum Khan

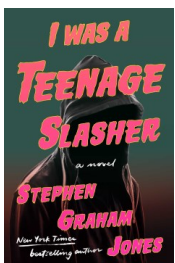

by Delilah S. Dawson

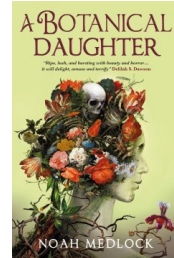

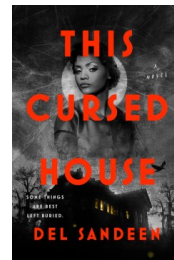
A good kid in a small Texas town finds himself cursed to kill for revenge in true slasher film-style, in the new novel by the bestselling author of *The Only Good Indians*.

by S. A. Barnes

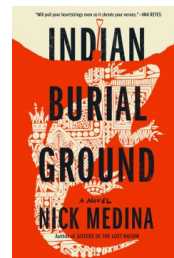

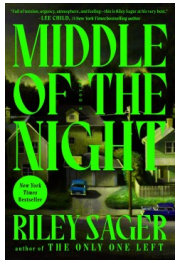


Indian Burial Ground

by Riley Sager

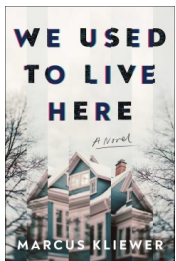

by Marcus Kliewer

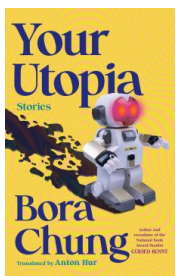

by Layla Martínez

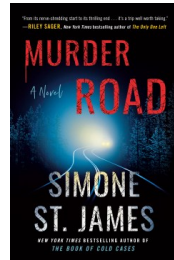

by Bridget Collins

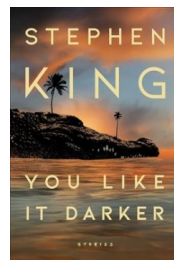
