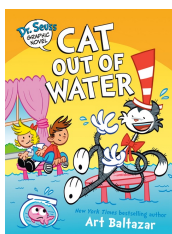

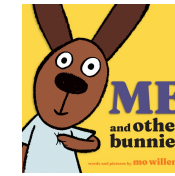


The Duck Never Blinks

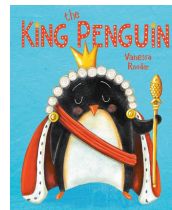


Little Freddie Two Pants: (The Dog With Too Many Pants)

Little Freddie doesn't know how many pants to wear, where he should wear them, if he should wear underwear, and if so, where he should put that underwear!

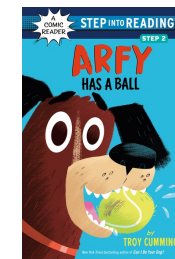


The King Penguin

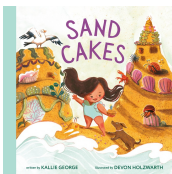


Arfy Has a Ball

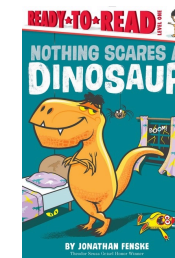
